The great-grandson of this John Stewart, and great-grandfather of the above Robert, the first Marquis, (who died in 1821,) was Colonel William Stewart, of Ballylawn Castle, who raised a troop of horse at his own expense, during the siege of the city of Londonderry by King James II., and was of essential service to the Protestants, by protecting those who were well affected to King William III., and checking the depredations of James's army, whose supplies he completely cut off on that side, and considerably cramped the operations of the siege. Martha, who married John Kennedy, Esq., of Caltra, in the county of Down. Thomas, the elder, succeeded at Ballylawn castle, and served as a captain in his relation's, Lord Mountjoy's, regiment. This Thomas married Mary, the second daughter of Barnard Ward, Esq., ancestor of the Viscount Bangor, and dying without issue in 1740, was succeeded by his second brother, Alexander, (born in 1700,) who represented the city of Londonderry in parliament, and purchased the estate of Mount Stewart, in the county of Down, (formerly the Mount-Alexander estate,) from the Colville family. He married, June 30, 1737, his cousin Mary, only daughter of John Cowan, of Londonderry, Esq., died April 2, 1781, and was succeeded by his eldest son Robert. His first promotion was into the Acton, one of the old 44s upon two decks; he then became third lieutenant of the Hero, 74, one of Commodore Johnstone's squadron in the afir at Porto Praya; and afterwards first of the Magnanime of 64 guns, from which ship he was removed into the Superb, 74, bearing the flag of Sir Edward Hughes, by whom he was made a Commander in the Lizard Cutter, at Bombay, in 1782; and further promoted to the Naiade frigate, captured from the French by the Sceptre. His post commission bore date April 26, 1783. After the termination of the American war, our officer obtained the command of the Vestal, of 28 guns, and was ordered to convey the brother of the present Lord Cai Heart on an embassy to the Emperor of China. The Ambassador was in a bad state of health when he embarked at Portsmouth, and continued to grow worse daily until the ship's arrival in the Straits of Banca, when he died. Sir Richard afterwards carried General Meadows to his government at Bombay; and during his continuance in the East Indies, distinguished himself on several occasions in supporting the British commercial rights, which would otherwise have been injured by interlopers under neutral colours, countenanced by some French frigates, as well as by the Governors of the garisons belonging to that nation. In the month of Nov. 1791, whilst cruising off the Malabar coast, in the Phenix frigate, he fell in with la Resolu, of 46 guns, conveying two country coasting vessels to Mangalore (the principal sea-port of Tippoo Saib), supposed to be laden with stores and provisions for that chieftain, with whom we were then at war.
